Muki Tsur was born in Jerusalem in 1938. He served in the Kibbutz Youth Brigade and has been a member of Kibbutz Ein Gev, on the shores of the Kinneret, since 1956. He studied Jewish philosophy and kabbalah at the Hebrew University and researched the early Zionist movement in Israel. A biographer and expert in the history of the pioneer movement and the kibbutz, he is a former secretary general of the kibbutz movement.

Currently, he teaches at *Binah* (center for Jewish identity and Hebrew culture), the movement's school for Judaism, and the *Kinneret* College. He also teaches groups of young people who promote communal life and education throughout Israel.

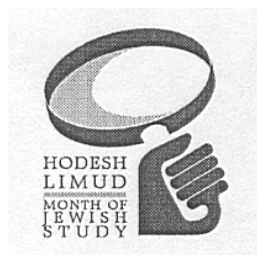

This year marks the 100th anniversary of the founding in what is now Israel of the first kibbutz—*Deganiah* (“Wheat of God”).

From there, the kibbutz movement took off, and though *kibbutzniks* never comprised more than four percent of Israeli society, they went on to play a disproportionate role in the country's politics, military, economy, and national identity.

In *Inventing Our Life: The Kibbutz Experiment*, a documentary film-in-progress, Toby Perl Freilich looks at the evolution of the kibbutz from its inception to the present, drawing on the memories and reflections of members from five kibbutzim.

What New in the Library?



Walking Israel: A Personal Search for the Soul of a Nation by Martin Fletcher. The well-known television correspondent went on a walking tour of Israel's coastline. His goal was to talk to ordinary people about their experiences and issues that interested them for this unusual travelogue. In Fletcher's words, "I wanted to write a book that would take readers beyond the familiar yet constricted stories of guns and bombs and closer to the true nature of this unique country." (956.94 FLE)

A Privilege to Die: Inside Hezbollah's Legions and their Endless War Against Israel by Thanassis Cambanis. Part standing army, part political party, and part theological movement, Hezbollah's widespread popularity rests on its ability to offer its followers economic reform, affordable health care, dependable electricity, and other benefits. Cambanis follows a few Hezbollah families and puts a human face on the Party of God so that we may understand the roots of today's conflicts. (956.05 CAM)

Blooms of Darkness by Aharon Appelfeld. Bruno's mother is unable to find a peasant willing to hide her son from the Nazis. As a last resort, she asks an old school friend who is currently working as a prostitute. Her friend, Marianne, hides Bruno in her closet at the brothel, letting him out during the day when her German customers are gone. The philosophical discussions between Bruno and Marianne and the lyrical writing make this a beautiful novel to experience. (FIC APP)

This is Where I Leave You by Jonathan Tropper. When Judd Foxman's father dies, his dying request is that his wife and their adult children spend seven days together as a family. This would be the first time they had been under one roof for many years. At the same time, Judd's marriage is on the rocks. When the Foxman family reluctantly gathers together, old grudges, secrets and passions resurface and things gradually spin out of control. This book is written with caustic wit, sarcasm and humor. It is an easy, enjoyable read. (FIC TRO)
