# JEWISH ODDS, ENDS & JOYS WITH RABBI MATT



## Preparing Together

Remember the time in mid-February when we had those three glorious teaser days of spring? The temperature rose, the snow melted, and we collectively decided winter was over in Cleveland. Lighter jackets came out. Windows rolled down. Walks were taken. Grills were fired up. We were scrambling for spring, but we weren't quite ready yet. And then, as quickly as it came, it was gone. A blizzard rolled in and sent us right back into winter. It was a reminder that sometimes we rush toward something before we have truly prepared for it.

Passover is different. Passover does not sneak up on us. It invites preparation. Before the Israelites ever leave Egypt, before the sea splits, before freedom begins, God commands them to get ready. In Exodus 12, they select the lamb days in advance, mark their doorposts, and eat with belts fastened and staffs in hand. Redemption does not just happen to them. They prepare themselves for it, and so do we.

In the weeks leading up to Passover, we shop and scrub, clean and clear. We empty cabinets, hunt for crumbs, plan menus, and pull out dishes we use only once a year. We prepare our homes, and in doing so, we begin preparing our hearts. Our Jewish tradition even teaches that we should begin studying the laws of Passover thirty days before the holiday.

Here at Temple, that sacred preparation is already underway for our Third Annual Second Seder on April 2. Congregants are already cooking, shopping, chopping, baking, and stirring. Staff and volunteers will be setting tables, coordinating reservations, and arranging seating so no one feels alone. There are emails and phone calls, grocery lists and careful planning, and beneath it all, a deep sense of pride. The preparation may take more time than the Seder itself. The evening will be beautiful and meaningful, and like all sacred moments, it will pass more quickly than we expect.

But the holiness does not begin when we lift the first cup of wine. It begins now, even a month away. It begins in kitchens across our community. It begins in the hands preparing food for people they may not know well. It begins in the quiet acts of generosity that make space at the table for someone else. That is what makes our Second Seder truly a family affair from beginning to end, not just because we sit together, but because we build it together.

The preparation is not separate from the celebration. The preparation is part of the holiness, and it is what will make the Seder we share together even more sacred.

Dear Friends,

TEE Brotherhood hopes that you, along with the other families of Temple Emanu El, will **light a yellow candle in your home on Erev Yom HaShoah, Monday April 13, 2026.** As Jews, we light the candle in memory of the victims of the Holocaust. The act of kindling this flame and reading the enclosed meditation can be a moving ritual in recalling what happened to our People not so long ago. It also provides an excellent opportunity to discuss the Holocaust with our children. Placing the candle in your window also serves to remind our neighbors and local communities of this tragic period in our history.

Brotherhood participates in the Yom HaShoah Yellow Candle Program, a nation-wide project of the Federation of Jewish Men's Clubs and supported by the Men Of Reform Judaism. It is our hope that this event, centered on the lighting of this special memorial Yellow Candle, will become an annual ritual in your home and eventually in the home of every member of our congregation. Many of our Temple families have already noted this commemoration as an important day on their Jewish calendar and attend the annual Shoah community memorial.

Candles will be available for pick up at Temple Emanu El starting at the beginning of April. You may pick yours up at the security desk during business hours. Representatives from Brotherhood will also be giving out yellow candles on Sundays, March 15 and April 12 from 9:00 am to 12:00 pm.

To help underwrite the cost of this program, donations are welcome. Donations received over and above expenses will go directly **to support educational programming**, thereby enabling our temple members to connect more fully with our Jewish heritage, and ultimately ensure the future of our people.

Please consider gifts in multiples of \$18. The number 18 is Chai, meaning "life". **It is by remembering that we do our part to ensure the future of our people, and celebrate their ongoing vibrance, even as we memorialize those whose lives were destroyed.** We appreciate your support of our efforts in this Yom HaShoah commemoration and our ongoing education programs.

We hope that you and your family will participate on Monday evening, April 13<sup>th</sup>, in this small but meaningful project.
