



If you flip through a Jewish calendar this month, you'll notice something strange about the month of Cheshvan — nothing. No fasting or feasting, no shofar blasts or sukkah walls, no apples dipped in honey or dancing around with the Torah scrolls. Just... "Mar" Cheshvan.

Tradition calls it *mar* — "bitter" — because it's the only month with no Jewish holidays. For most Jews, that can feel a little bitter. After all, the whirlwind of holidays is over, and suddenly our calendars look suspiciously empty. But for rabbis? It's anything but bitter. After the marathon of Tishrei — Rosh Hashanah, Yom Kippur, Sukkot, and Simchat Torah — we finally get to breathe. If Tishrei is the spiritual triathlon, Cheshvan is the couch, a mug of tea, and a long nap. Around here, we call it *Ahhh-Cheshvan*.

Maybe that's the hidden gift of this quiet month. Pirkei Avot 4:3 teaches: "Do not dismiss any thing, for there is no thing that does not have its place." Cheshvan's place in the Jewish year is the pause — the moment between the High Holy Days and the holidays when we catch our breath, absorb all we've experienced, and settle back into the rhythm of ordinary time and holiness.

After weeks of sound and celebration, we get to practice the quieter parts of Jewish life — gratitude, kindness, showing up for one another, and noticing the blessings that don't come with a holiday name.

And maybe it's no coincidence that Cheshvan leads us right toward Thanksgiving — the most Jewish of American holidays. It's basically Sukkot 2.0: a harvest festival filled with gratitude, food, and family (and slightly fewer *etrogim*).

So yes, Mar Cheshvan has no holidays but that doesn't mean it lacks holiness. Sometimes the most sacred thing you can do is stop, breathe, and appreciate the calm.

May this month be less *mar* and more *mellow*: a time for rest, reflection, and quiet gratitude before the next celebration — or the next plate of latkes — arrives.
